Year 5 Opportunity Class Placement Application for 2025

Opportunity classes are for primary school students who have high academic potential or who are intellectually gifted. They provide an environment where students can learn and make friends with classmates of similar ability. This can benefit a student's academic progress and wellbeing.

Opportunity classes are offered in Years 5 and 6, with parents/carers applying in Year 4.

Students who are successfully placed will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6. Opportunity classes are just one of the ways that we cater for our high potential and gifted students.

Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered on the results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test. Students who wish to be considered for placement are required to sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on Thursday 1st August 2024.

You must use your own email address and not one belonging to your child. Late applications are not usually accepted.

Number Talks

3 Gulamany engage in daily number talks to build our flexibility, efficiency and accuracy in mathematical thinking. We have been developing our skills by sharing and discussing the strategies we used to solve a problem.



Science and Technology

As part of our Science unit Food and Fibre Production 3 Gulamany have been investigating how technology is used to produce foods and fibres. In small groups, we were tasked with designing, making and testing a model of an irrigation system that could transport at least 50ml of water over a a minimum distance of 15cm. We had lots of fun creating our models and testing them.

Why do schools assess students?

Students recently undertook NAPLAN assessments in Year 3 and Year 5. These assessments are part of a toolkit of assessments teachers provide for students to create a picture of their learning and for teachers to map where to next in learning. The primary purpose of assessment is to promote learning. Assessment provides evidence of how learners are progressing

is to promote learning. Assessment provides evidence of how learners are progressing according to defined standards throughout a period of learning, as well as achievement at the end of the learning period.

The frameworks for assessing students' learning are undergoing fundamental changes as we implement the English and Maths K-10 syllabi.

Three developments underpin this transformation:

- · new thinking which relates to how assessment monitors learning and supports growth,
- new metrics represents assessment of a broader range of skills and attributes aligned to current pedagogies across literacy and numeracy, and
- new technologies -that transform assessment practices through more personalised, formative assessment and interactive online assessment tools.

These three assessment improvements, together with evidence-based teacher knowledge of best practices in learning, have seen our staff review, reflect, re-modifying and implement high quality assessment practices. When teachers collaborate to plan, design and deliver assessment they develop greater insight into where students are at in their learning.

Over the next two weeks students will complete PAT assessments in Reading and Maths. This will support teachers to identify strengths and future teaching direction for individuals, small groups and whole class focus areas. We encourage you to support your child in seeing assessments as a celebration point.






Bush Babies OOSH has been providing before & after school care at Warrimoo Public School since May 2020. We pride ourselves in providing a safe and fun time for all involved. Vacation Care is a new addition we offer to our local community. The costs displayed are additional to the cost per day, and if we get many children taking part, we pass on the lower perhead cost for Incursions.

Incursions / Excursions

All children who are enrolled in Vacation Care Program are required to participate in an excursion/incursion if this occurs on the child's booked days. For excursions, a permission form is required. Any additional fees will be automatically charged to your account. Excursions may change due to weather. Can you please, email or tell an educator if your child/ren will be absent on any days that they are booked in especially on excursion days?

COST: Full fee is \$66.50 per day with additional cost for incursion/excursions. Bush Babies OOSH is approved and offers Child Care Subsidy on fees and additional costs.

*SUNCARE – Sun protection is important to us at Bush Babies OOSH & Vacation Care. Children must apply sunscreen between the hours of 9am and 4.30pm as required by Bush Babies Sun Protection Policy & the Sun Smart APP (which determines UV rating - a rating of 3 and above requires sun protection).

What to bring?

Please ensure your child/ren bring the following items every day.

FOOD / DRINK - Children are required to bring morning tea & lunch. We will provide afternoon tea. We cannot heat/reheat children's food. We strive to be a nut-free service. Please send a drink bottle with your child

HATS / SHOES – All children must have a hat to play outside

It is also essential that all children wear enclosed shoes. Sneakers & socks are

CLOTHING – Children should wear seasonally casual clothes & a jacket or jumper as it can get cold quickly. Spare clothes can be sent for messy/water

SUNCARE – Sun care is very important to us at Vacation Care. The children will be required to apply sunscreen while in care. If your child requires sensitive sunscreen or you would like to pack their own, please feel free to pack it in their bag and let a staff member know. *see left
